IMPORTANT NOTICES

This notice is regarding the locked screen doors. You all have been given a Pest Control Notice and Schedule. You know that Pest Control will be in your apartment on the 3rd Thursday every 3 months. You also know that in order to keep pest down or gone we have to do this. You do not have to be home during the pest control but if you are home, please make sure your screen door is unlocked so that we can get in and do the required pest control treatment. If you have your screen door locked and do not answer the door after pounding on the outside door we cannot treat your apartment, and that, in turn, impedes us from doing our job. This is a lease violation. It is in your SIGNED rules and regulations that you cannot deny us access to your apartment during pest control, work orders, inspections or any other reason that we may need to be in your apartment.

It was also noticed during our REAC Inspection that people were putting trash out way too early. We are asking you to put your trash out no earlier than the NIGHT before your trash day. We also noticed that the trash was being set out in bags only. These bags are getting torn open by stray animals. No body is picking up the mess but the housing staff. This has to stop. If you put your trash out in a bag, put it out the NIGHT before your trash day, if your bag gets torn open then YOU need to pick up YOUR mess. You can get a can with a good lid, if the lid is not attached, tie a string to your can. Mark it up so that you know it is your can. It looks a lot nicer as well. Please help us keep your home and grounds clean and appealing.

Work orders need to be called in as soon as you notice them. We have had several people tell maintenance that a problem has been going on for several days but they just didn't call it in. This problem could start costing you money. You need to call them in as you get them. Do not wait until you have several things to be worked on. If you continue to hold workorders, you will be charged for them. Call them in as soon as you notice something. DO NOT WAIT!

Baked Corned Beef and Cabbage

Ingredients

4 1/2 lbs corned beef brisket
5 black peppercorns
1/2 tsp garlic powder
1 onion, peeled and left
whole
2 bay leaves
1 pinch salt
1 small head cabbage, cored
and cut into wedges
6 large potatoes, quartered
4 large carrots, peeled and
sliced
1/4 cup chopped fresh parsley
2 tbsp butter

Directions

- 1. In a 6 quart Dutch oven, place the beef brisket, peppercorns, garlic powder, onion, bay leaves and salt. Fill pan with water to cover everything plus one inch. Bring to a boil and cook for 20 minutes. Skim off any residue that floats to the top. Reduce heat to a simmer and cook for 2 to 3 hours, until meat can be pulled apart with a fork.
- 2. Once meat is done, add cabbage, potatoes and carrots, pressing them down into the liquid. Simmer for an additional 15 minutes or until the potatoes are tender. Skim off any oil that comes to the surface. Stir in the butter and parsley. Remove the pot from the heat.
- 3. Remove meat from the pot and place onto a serving dish and let rest for 15 minutes. Also remove the vegetables to a bowl and keep warm. Slice meat on the diagonal against the grain. Serve meat on a platter an spoon juices over meat and vegetables.
